As Lent begins this week I am sure many councils, like my own, have had a discussion of where they may be able to contribute. Here is some information on the funds supported by the League at the Provincial and National Levels.

1. Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace (CCODP)
2. Catholic Missions in Canada
3. Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA)
4. Coady International Institute Fund
5. Euthanasia Prevention Coalition
6. Kee-Pas Mission Project
7. House of Peace

I can't answer questions councils may have about CCODP – as far as I can find out there has not been an official conclusion issued from the Canadian Council of Catholic Bishops.

Catholic Missions in Canada supports more than 600 missionaries across 26 Canadian mission centers.

CNEWA supports the poor throughout the Middle East, Northeast Africa, India and Eastern Europe. In the National Communiqués from Faith Anderson and Marie Rackley information is shared about the second year of the National theme and the goal to raise funds for a drinking water well for the Pieta Bhavan Project.

The Coady Institute works with innovative people and organizations to create effective and practical solutions to reduce global poverty and injustice.

The House of Peace is an intercultural, life affirming community that welcomes all. It is a safe home for women in transition, promoting justice, peace and understanding.

Certain amounts are recommended for these charities based on membership or 1% of members spending on personal items such as clothing, jewelry or cosmetics.

Recruit members and maintain membership

Did you know that in 1912 in the earliest days the Catholic women of Canada were first organized in the Archdiocese of Edmonton to assist with the care and placement of the ever-increasing influx of immigrants from Europe and elsewhere? According to the Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada Departmental Plan 2018–2019, Canada expected to welcome between 290,000 and 330,000 new permanent residents. I don't know what percentage of these would be Roman Catholic, but we did learn at National Convention in 2017 that the largest growth to our churches was coming from new Canadians! Is your council doing anything to welcome these newcomers? You may want to try to have a conversation with some church members to ascertain what their needs are – can someone help with childcare, rides to appointments, just friendly chats? Personal face-to-face invitations still do work the best. Always be friendly and welcoming, and try to communicate through tone of voice and body language that people are welcomed and valued. Try to demonstrate that you are a happy, vibrant team, enjoy each other's company and do fun things together; watch how others will be drawn to you and want to be a part of this organization!

Annual fees are due January 1, a good excuse to activate your phone tree and extend a personal invitation to existing members! You probably have one or two more meetings before the January 1 deadline.

Strategic Planning

The latest report on the CWL website from the Strategic Planning Committee is dated October 1 – if you have not yet done so, please read it to keep yourself informed. The report explains why it feels like things are moving so slowly – the committee took a while to get things moving – members were appointed, volunteers were sought and the work continued!
