We wanted an end to Covid-19, Delta and Omicron. We wanted, after 3 weeks an end to the Freedom Convoy and now we want an end to the conflict between the Ukraine and Russia. What "we" want and what "God" wants are without a doubt not necessarily the same. These 3 events have shown us the very best in people and the evil that lives in others. Have we prayed for Covid and the Convoy like we are praying now for the Ukraine? A heartfelt ache came over me and I felt that ache for a whole country and its' people when I heard. I promised my Ukrainian friend that from that day on I would pray a rosary daily till this conflict is resolved.

The **CCCB** is encouraging the faithful and all people of good will to pray for the imminent restoration of peace, dialogue and human fraternity.. The head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, the Ecumenical Patriarch and Catholic Bishops, they implore for all involved to pursue non-violent means to resolve disputes and disagreements. Military force does not favour dialogue and peace, it rather endangers innocent human life and the security and safety of all people caught in the conflict.

Pope Francis, who has entrusted this situation to the intercession of Mary, the Mother of God, we ask Our Lady through her powerful intercession, to open hearts so that anger, resentment and division may start to be healed and for further unnecessary violence to be avoided. Marriage and Family: (taken from D. Johansen report)

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB) has established a standing committee for family and life. Two of the purposes of this committee are to assist the CCCB in responding to the pastoral needs of married couples and families and helping it affirm and strengthen the domestic church in every household and proclaim the Christian teachings on marriage and family. Resources are available to assist you in preparing for participating in events during the National Week for Life, which coincides with the United Nations International Day of Families on May 15th each year.

Sanctity of Life: (D. Johansen)

The other purposes of the family and life committee are to assist the CCCB in responding to new questions raised by contemporary ethical debates, such as medical assistance in dying and promoting the dignity and sacredness of human life at all stages of life, from conception to natural death. (Check the CCCB website for resources that identify government legislation on life issues and responses from the church.)

Campaign Life Coalition organizes the National March for Life to be held on May 12, 2022. Hopefully the March for Life won't be cancelled as it has been in the past two years.

Euthanasia: (D. Johansen)

National council affirmed its support for Euthanasia Prevention Coalition through a motion to continue the temporary national voluntary fund until August 31, 2022. Please ask your diocesan counterparts to consider informing members about this fund and direct them to the resources available to enhance their knowledge about preventing euthanasia at epcc.ca/

World Youth Day:

World Youth Day will be held in August 2023 in Lisbon, Portugal. I would hope that every parish encourages and supports their youth in attending. My daughter attended in 2000 (in Rome) and stood 15-20 feet away from Pope John Paul. I spoke with her this morning and after all these years you can hear the joy and excitement in her voice when relating the experience. Such a positive effect it had!

It's been four months since CWL Day of Celebration. It was a wonderful day in a lot of ways, I laughed, I cried. The program was wonderful and thought provoking thanks to our National President and to Fr. Paul. I was also blessed with being presented the Belle Guerrin Award by two fantastic and dedicated women of the League. I had no clue whatsoever of whom they were speaking of. I thought "oh, someone else who's been in as long as I have". Janet and Crystal, you did a fantastic job and you managed to get my husband in on the secret and joining in the presentation and for lunch. Thank-you Margaret Silverthorne for nominating me and to Prov. Executive for approving the nomination. I'm ever so grateful.

A lot has happened in the past few months. Amazing how life can be disrupted and become an inconvenience and scare us all, all because of Covid 19. When you think of the countries that have been denied practicing their Catholic faith, of receiving the sacraments for decades, we have had but a small taste of what that is. We long after only this short time to go back and celebrate God. All of Easter season will have gone by with no church attendance. We have participated in virtual mass, we have done Novenas, Spiritual Bouquets and recited the Rosary daily during the month of May. Covid19 gave us time to pray, reflect and realize that faith and family are most important.

WALK FOR LIFE: All organizations cancelled their planned activities. The Walk for Life became a virtual walk as we join with Ottawa, online and participate in the walk that way. I look forward to next year when we can hopefully join, participate and support the Walk.

FAMILY LIFE: Covid 19 proved deadly in other ways. It affected the elderly, they could not see family and many succumbed to the illness "alone". How terribly sad and tragic for the patient and their families.

The pandemic has wreaked havoc in family life for a great many people throughout Canada. There has been an "epidemic of domestic abuse" during this pandemic (Free Press April 15/20). The Crown Attorney states that there have been up to that date an "unprecedented number of cases of domestic and child abuse. There has been an escalation of abuse due to tension in the homes. All this togetherness gets on some people's nerves. Some live in crowded conditions, lost jobs, shortage of food in the home, mostly a shortage of patience and coping skills. Those who suffer the most are the children. Funding and Resources to shelters have been reduced and social distancing in shelters are a concern. We as CWL are at the front line against domestic violence and child abuse. We must keep working to stop this epidemic. Through the years the CWL has been very generous in supporting these issues (shelters, food banks, soup kitchens) and are called to support more so now than ever.

VAPING: The CWL had "Resolution 2014.02 Electronic Cigarettes" which was presented to

gov't in regards to vaping. It continues to be an attraction to secondary students. It presents severe respiratory health issues and even death in young people.(lung transplant in an 18 yr. old State side due to his vaping). Vaping may increase severe symptoms and complications in people infected with Covid 19. More work has to be done to prevent the growing use of vaping products. "Vaping has more than doubled since 2017" (Free Press) In a survey taken, 40% reported daily or near daily use of the products used in vaping. Increased vaping and its unknown consequences threaten the health of our youth: it has been linked to higher risk of progression to cigarette smoking when it was introduced as a means to quit smoking. Being from a small rural community, living through this crucial time in history, with COVID-19 appears to me to be easier than in an urban center. We are already distanced from socially interacting a lot as there's no place to go and we tend to be stocked up and learned a long time ago to make do. It's easier to follow the rules set up for us.

On the website CCCB, cccb.ca you will find the beautiful "Hope, Gratitude and Solidarity: A Message to Canadians from Religious Leaders in Canada in Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

(from my Prov. Council chairperson)

On vaticannews.va is the following message "The Dicastery has also proposed a votive Mass "specifically to implore God to end this pandemic." The opening prayer reads:

"Almighty and eternal God, our refuge in every danger, to whom we turn in our distress: in faith we pray, look with compassion on the afflicted, grant eternal rest to the dead, comfort to mourners, healing to the sick, peace to the dying, strength to healthcare workers, wisdom to our leaders and courage to reach out to all in love, so that together we may give glory to your holy name."

Sanctity of Life

The CCCB issued its response to Bill C-7 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medical assistance in dying) which tabled on Monday, February 24, 2020

In response, the bishops expressed concern with Bill C-7 which "seeks to expand the eligibility criteria for euthanasia and assisted suicide by removing the "reasonable foreseeability of natural death criterion in the Criminal Code and by loosening some of the existing 'safeguards' allowing patients whose death is 'reasonable foreseeable' to waive final consent to receiving euthanasia by making an advance directive"

In voicing strong opposition to the proposed legislation, the bishops call upon "all Canadians who also oppose the new Bill to make their voices heard" and urge members of Parliament to acknowledge the giftedness of life as an inalienable right not to be taken away by others, the importance of compassion for the ill and dying, as well as the responsibility to protect the most vulnerable."

Archbishop Richard Gagnon (Winnipeg), president of the CCCB, asks the League to encourage members to send individual letters to their members of parliament. This need not be a complicated affair. A convenient platform is available on the Coalition for HealthCARE and Conscience [website, canadiansforconscience.ca](http://www.canadiansforconscience.ca). An electronic letter to one's respective member of parliament automatically generated after the required contact information fields are filled.

March for Life

I await further instruction here in Manitoba in regards to the March for Life to be held in May. Things may change a lot from now till then due to COVID-19.

Social Justice

Many still volunteer at food banks while still practicing “social distancing” and fewer donations are being made.

We must continue to challenge Bill C-7, show the government that good “palliative care” is very much available in our hospitals and respite homes.

Ministry to Seniors, the Disabled and Youth:

Speaking of a “human life”, how many of you this summer had the opportunity to see the movie “**Unplanned**”? For those us who had the opportunity, speaking for myself it was emotionally disturbing and I cried. It reminded me of when as a young woman, I worked at the Vancouver General Hospital and there were marches back then against abortion and the lawn in front of the hospital was covered in bouquets of Baby Roses in remembrance of all those tiny lives taken.

I will provide the date for “March for Life” when contacts and plans have been made.

Euthanasia: We are encouraged to read “LifeCanada's” article, “The Current Situation of MAID in Canada” at lifecanada.org to learn about the status of medical assistance in dying. In comparing other countries in the world, Canada has an unusually high number at over 4000 deaths since legalization in 2016.

Ministry to Separated and Divorced:

In the spring issue of the Canadian League magazine there is an article on the “Annulment Process”. It used to take years to get an annulment in the Catholic Church. The process was long, required people vouching for you etc. and if you had the money you could speed things along. With approximately half the marriages ending in divorce the process has been revised. At the Fireside Chats with Fr. Caruso in Mesa, Arizona, he related to us that the process should only take 18 months (in the U.S) Fr. Caruso sat on that committee so was knowledgeable about the topic.
